FEJ was founded in 1985 by Lucienne Duncan, who was born and raised in Lamardelle, Haiti. Its initial mission was to break the cycle of poverty in Lamardelle, but it expanded to other parts of Haiti as well.



## 2018

# PROJECT OVERVIEWS

## LAMARDELLE SCHOOL

Lucienne A. Duncan Mixed Institution” (I.M.L.A.D.) in honor to Manmie Lucienne Ange-Lucie Duncan’s mission is to bridge the growing literacy gap for underprivileged children and their families in Lamardelle regardless of gender or belief. We advocate that Education is freedom and power where the learning process is of great value, and should be accessible to all children. The school curriculum is managed in accordance with the criteria imposed by the Haitian Ministry of Education.

The operation of the school has allowed FEJ to have years of experience and knowledge to overcome multiple obstacles and learn to better assess the needs of the community. I.M.L.A.D. provides primary and elementary education to the children of Lamardelle, a rural area not far from Croix-des-Bouquets. With the help of partners such as FEJ-USA, AFEJ and Action Medeor, we were able to provide nutritional and medical care to children.

We are always striving to do more to continue to promote education in the community of Lamardelle. The pilot project proposed by the principal of the school, aimed at including the 3rd cycle of the fundamental where children will have the opportunity to continue their secondary education in school at the end of their primary cycle could only be implemented with the 7th basic year.



# LAMARDELLE SCHOOL (CONT.)

After the Christmas party on January 7, 2022, lessons were resumed for all classes. The first week was considered a week of revision in preparation for the organization of the exams for the first test. As agreed, the evaluations took place from January 13 to 17, 2022. In the fundamental exam, 305 students participated: 82.21% passed, and 17.79% failed.

This school year has been a real challenge for FEJ and for IMLAD in particular. However, thanks to the determination and professionalism of the entire team, we have been able to overcome these challenges and achieve the objectives planned for the school year.

## Child Protection Service

Child Protection Service (CPS) has under its direction the crèche which participates in the integration mission. Our vision at the crèche is to be able to provide a hopeful future for many of the country's abandoned, orphaned and needy people. In addition to caring for the physical needs and safety of these children, we also ensure that everyone receives individual love and attention. For the children who do not have the chance to be adopted, while waiting to be with their permanent family, we give them love, a framework for character development, education and opportunities to receive valuable skills that will enable them to be independent and ultimately be able to contribute in Haitian society and culture.

In order to respond, we organized a whole range of activities that contribute to the holistic development of the children in our care. Our intervention respects the right to Health, Education, Spare-time and to have a Family in accordance with the Convention on the Rights of Children. FEJ believes that every abandoned or orphaned child deserves a loving home with parents who provide care, education and safety.

This program is very important because it provides children with a secure future while having access to love, affection, health care and education. Its main focus has been on child protection, nutrition, education and health. Through this program, the FEJ has also raised awareness among some parents about the phenomenon of child abandonment and the phenomenon of "restavék".

Thanks to volunteers and donors like you, the Child Protection Service was able to provide care to 38 children of the Crèche, of whom 15 were new admissions for this period. The good hearts of the adoptive parents welcomed 17 children into their homes and 3 children were reintegrated into their biological families.

## Community Health Clinic

"Clinique Communautaire Enfant Jésus à Lamardelle" (CCEJL) is at the heart of the FEJ's health care program. Access to health care is extremely difficult for residents of remote areas such as Lamardelle. The FEJ built the clinic to meet this need and ensure that the community of Lamardelle and surrounding areas have access to high quality health care. The clinic offers regular medical services, including vaccines, prenatal care, maternity, physiotherapy and paediatrics, as well as educational services, such as nutritional programs for children and pregnant women with the generous support of our donor Action Medeor.

The FEJ maternity project aims to strengthen the institutional care of pregnant women at the Clinic. Lamardelle has a high rate of maternal death. Almost

all pregnant women living in the Lamardelle region (90%) give birth at home without the help of qualified staff. The maternity project seeks to change that. Our goal is to reduce the maternal and neonatal mortality rate by reducing the percentage of home births by 50% and increasing the use of qualified medical personnel during childbirth.

Volunteers, donors and our other partners have allowed us to continue to meet the needs of our community.



## Intensive Treatment Unit

This unit was set up in partnership with the Caris Foundation and involves working directly with sick or abandoned children to stabilize them. The main objective of the unit is to provide services especially to children living with HIV and malnutrition. This includes the provision of medical care, balanced meals and enrichment activities. The lead doctor in the program conducts research to determine the child's history, including parents and/or extended family, reasons for abandonment, family economic status, academic history and medical history.

Through this program, the specialized unit will ultimately have the capacity to serve 25 children at a time: 0 to 6 years old, and also teenagers up to 18 years old. In general, it takes 3-4 months to stabilize a child (0 to 6 months) and carry out a thorough family assessment. Once both actions are completed, the child is transferred to the FEJ crèche for adoption (Haitian or international) or reunited with a family member. In 2022 we cared for 77 children in the unit plus another 55 who were treated as out-patients.

### Birth at the Clinic

At the beginning of 2020, we had our first birth at the clinic. She was a healthy little girl weighing 3.2 kilos and our second birth was a 3.1 kilos baby boy. For this fiscal year, we had made 58 deliveries at the community clinic. It was a real success compared to the previous years and we hope that this will continue like this.



### Christmas at the Crèche and the School

The children of the "Crèche Enfant Jésus (CEJ)" and IMLAD celebrated Christmas as they do every year. Music, games and dance were there for this festive atmosphere. The children had a great time throughout the day in this Christmas party atmosphere and all received gifts.





## LEED Certification

We had received our WELL silver

certification for multi-family residential real estate. This demonstrates our firm commitment to supporting human health, well-being and comfort through the built environment. This is the only building in Haiti to receive this incredible honor and it completes our LEED Platinum certification that we received last September.

## Sick Woman at Lamardelle

One of our greatest accomplishments for this year was to have been able to help this woman from Lamardelle receive an operation on her breast to remove a large tumor. She was able to go to Cuba to have a mastectomy of the left breast and everything went well. She was healthy on her return to Lamardelle and we hope that she will continue to thrive.



## Carnival at IMLAD and the Crèche

Despite the difficult situation in the country, we were able to organize the

carnival for the children of the school and the crèche. To make this day even more fun for the children of the school, a manual workshop has been set up in each classroom. The children had the opportunity to make their own masks. After this manual work session, the children returned to the schoolyard in order to have fun to the sound of music. At the Crèche, there were dances and music. All the children had a good time in good humor and in a festive atmosphere.



## National children's Day

This Thursday, June 8, 2023 the children were happy to see so many worlds around them. The creche has followed in the footsteps of this event for a few years. We organized a recreational day, filled with special activities for children. The music, dance, songs, poetry and a gastronomic exhibition were on the agenda to mark this day.

## Intensive Treatment Unit Opening



On April 13, 2020, Fondation Enfant Jesus (FEJ) and its official partner Caris Foundation opened the Intensive Treatment Unit for children suffering from HIV and severe malnutrition.

The unit serves children all over

Haiti who have nowhere to turn for their difficult medical solutions. Our children receive medical care 24/7. We hope to add more beds and services so that we can take care of many more children. We have made a lot of progress with children who have been in our unit and we hope to be able to do much more for them. For our children who have been treated, we make sure they are well housed and have food. They receive a visit from a social worker every 3 months to make sure everything is okay.



## Celebration of the Flag Festival at the Crèche

The celebration of the 219th anniversary of the flag; Thursday, May 18 at the FEJ crèche with the children. It was a moment of reliving our glorious past and shaking the flag of the Freedom of our Heroes independence with all the children of the crèche.



## Greenhouse

Work has begun on the FEJ site in Lamardelle to build a greenhouse with donations from A Dollar A Tree for Haiti and Frantz Kenol. Once completed, this nursery will provide environmental and economic benefits to the entire community!

## Storms in Lamardelle

Not one, but two destructive little storms ravaged Lamardelle. Heavy rains and winds broke trees, cut power lines, flooded roads and ripped roots off at the school. But no deaths or major losses were recorded.



## Container Shipping

We had volunteers to help prepare the containers to send and organize shipments to Haiti. This is a great example of how working together can have great results. The containers contained medical supplies for Delmas 19, kits for midwives, food and cleaning products that we had been waiting for so long. A big thanks to all our donors that made all this possible. All these donations will be very useful because we provide care to children in our nursery and in the Intensive Treatment Unit!



### Max Sends His Love!

Max spent his early years in FEJ's care and now lives with his adoptive family in New York. He wanted to help the children who are still living at the Crèche. Thanks to his generous heart, with the help of his family and his church, he sent a large shipment of baby formula and supplements that are extremely difficult to find in Haiti. Our young Djephtey and other children will be able to benefit greatly from these supplies.

"The ties that unite us to FEJ date back to 2005. That year we had the great pleasure of becoming parents again. On December 29, 2005 exactly, Lucien and Gina told us that a little girl was waiting for us. This happiness was to

materialize on July 29, 2006 during my first trip to Haiti.

A welcome and a stay that I will always remember. I was greeted like a member of their family. Their kindness, their love of children but also their work capacity particularly marked me.

I visited the Crèche, at the time it was at Lamardelle where Charlène Eléonor was, the school which was still in its infancy but directed by an adorable and exceptional woman Mrs. Lucienne Duncan, mother of Lucien.

Lucien and Gina told me about their projects, including the small house near their home that would become the current day Creche, their wish to see all the children of the rural community of Lamardelle go to school, eat at their hunger, to be medically monitored. And thus offer them the possibility of staying with their families, in their country.

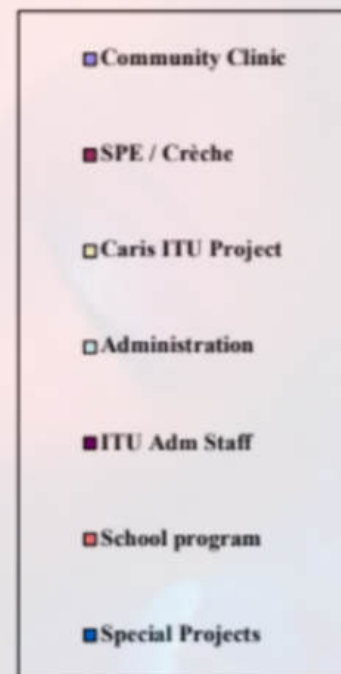
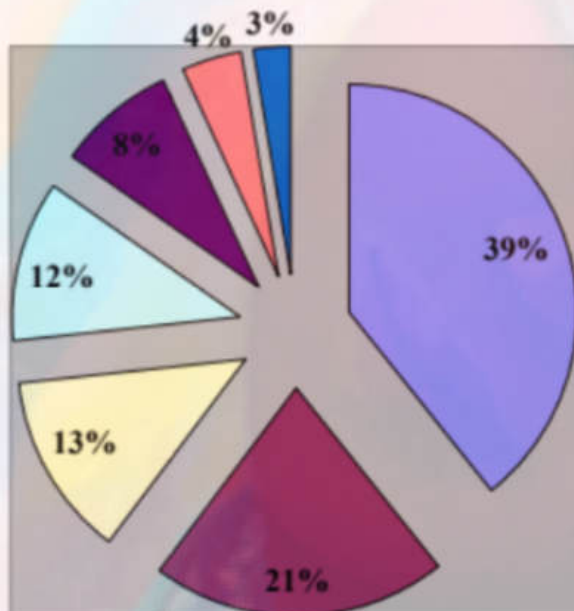
As soon as I returned, the idea of creating an association to help the FEJ germinated and never left me. 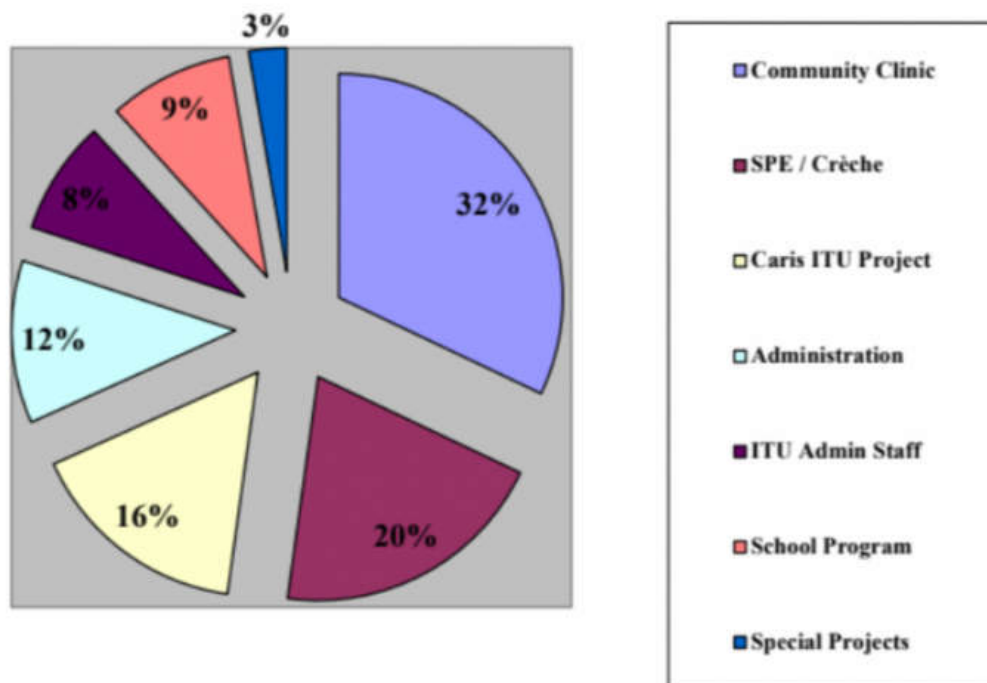

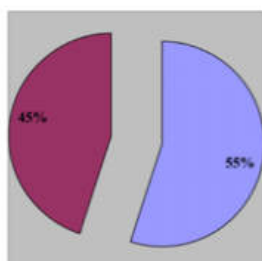

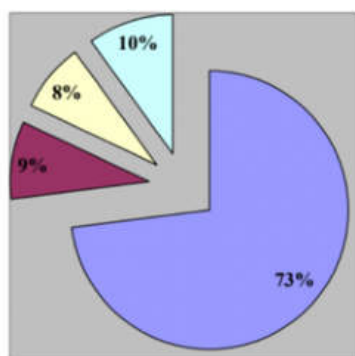
